Environmental Policy

Introduction

Castle Hedingham Parish Council is committed to protecting the environment and the natural heritage of the Parish. The Parish Council also recognises the need for sustainable development and the provision of quality public amenities and services.

The Parish Council is obliged to consider the impact of its functions on the parish, which includes the village of Castle Hedingham and its conservation area, Hedingham Castle, a Grade 1 scheduled ancient monument and the River Colne and Colne Valley.

Procedures

- In carrying out its own activities the Parish Council will aim to make a positive contribution to protecting and enhancing the environment by:
 - a. Minimising waste and pollution
 - b. Following a hierarchy of reducing, re-using and recycling
 - Eliminating the unnecessary use of energy and reducing greenhouse gas emissions
 - d. Providing information electronically and reducing the use of paper
 - e. Avoiding using single-use plastic items
- 2. When purchasing services and goods, the Parish Council will give preference to:
 - a. Local suppliers who pay at minimum the Living Wage
 - b. Options which are environmentally friendly and/or Fair Trade
 - c. Products which have been manufactured from recycled materials
 - d. Products which can be disposed of in an environmentally sustainable manner
- 3. The Parish Council will require that contractors and Councillors who carry out maintenance work on behalf of the Parish Council:
 - a. Minimise the use of harmful pesticides and chemicals
 - b. Work in a way that benefits wildlife and the environment
 - c. Use native, wildflower friendly species for planting where possible
 - d. Follow the Parish Council's environmental policy
- 4. In its decision making the Parish Council will take careful consideration of:
 - a. The importance of walking, cycling and public transport
 - b. The need to conserve and improve natural habitats
 - c. The need to protect vulnerable and protected species
 - d. The need to conserve the natural beauty of the parish and surrounding landscape
- 5. In addition, where possible, the Parish Council will:
 - Encourage the protection and enhancement of the unique character, beauty, heritage and biodiversity within the Parish
 - Ensure the Parish's natural beauty and heritage are not compromised by inappropriate development
 - c. Ensure the nature conservation value of the River Colne and Colne Valley is maintained and enhanced

- d. Encourage the protection of the integrity of biodiversity sites and sites of geological and geomorphological importance, and those of archaeological and historical value within the Parish
- e. Highlight the importance and value of our local environment and its contribution to our community's quality of life
- f. Encourage local action in support of the environment
- g. Improve the consistency of water quality to maintain a healthy river ecosystem
- h. Discourage all forms of littering, particularly dog fouling and single-use plastics
- i. Encourage the conservation and sustainable use of natural resources
- i. Encourage the reduction, reuse and recycling of resources within the Parish
- Encourage the use of materials and systems which improve energy efficiency of developments
- Support and encourage actions and initiatives to bring land into proactive conservation management
- m. Recognise the importance of hedgerows as an essential corridor for the movement of wildlife which may support many animals and plants
