Hedingham Castle hosts many events and was voted best castle for weddings in England. But Castle Hedingham is far more than this, with a special quality which comes from genuine pride in our community. The following information is from our residents:

Our Village Shop is community-run since 2017 and home to the Post Office.

We love the volunteers who serve us and create seasonal window displays, floral planters and post box toppers.

Our Village Park created in 2020 is a welcoming inclusive space, with a gold-award-winning children's play area, public toilets and new Community Allotment.

Social activities –Beavers, Cubs, Scouts & Guides with their own hut. Tennis club with coaching for children. Cricket club for all ages. Bowls Club celebrating its centenary year. Football Club with adult and youth teams. Arts groups, Castle Players drama, fitness groups, Hells Bells Morris Dancers, Heritage Society, Hedingham Singers, Women's Groups. The Bell Inn with live music, annual beer festival and choir was a finalist in national Pub Sustainability awards. Social Club and Village Hall with music, bingo and quizzes.

During Covid we were recognised for our exceptional work together supporting the village. Our "Avenue of Hope" of daffodils was created too, suggested, donated and planted by residents.
