

Blackberries are at their best in September so make the most of them — as they should never be picked after Michaelmas day — 29th September. Tradition says Lucifer cursed the bramble when he fell in one after being ejected from Heaven by St Michael, making its berries taste foul after Michaelmas. Old Michaelmas day fell on 10th October, so maybe allow a little leeway!

This is the time of year for wasps to make a nuisance of themselves. Unpopular at the best of times, by September the creatures are really behaving quite badly. Knowing why might make you a little more sympathetic! The majority of wasps have led a useful and blameless life thus far, predating pest insects which they feed to their young, which in turn exude sweet spit to feed the worker wasps. By autumn, there are no larvae in the nest so the worker wasps have to find alternative foods — jam, fizzy drinks and rotting, fermenting fruit.

Nest discipline has broken down, with the queens dying off and the new queens going into hibernation, so we're left with a lot of unemployed, possibly drunken worker wasps eking out an existence until the cold weather kills them off.




Friends of Alderford Mill

This year has seen a lot of activity to improve the visitor experience at the mill. The Wednesday team are fabricating the 1867 gearing from the steam engine to the stones. Without any information on the design of the original gear train the team is using historical data provided in contemporary mill design documents augmented by a more recent research document, "Perfect Pitch" detailing the progression of gear design over the last 400 years. Foot fall on open days has been disappointing so far this year, but the activities for the younger generation have been successful with many parents finding it difficult to tear their children away. However the Paranormal evening was a success with a good number of participants. Another is scheduled to follow the Halloween opening. We have added to our visitor experience by receipt of electronic tablets donated by Essex County Council. These are in use to provide experience of the upper floors for those not able or reluctant to tackle the steep stairs.

Recent legacies have enabled FOAM to plan ahead for the progressive supply of oak for the predicted failure of the elm water wheel timbers. Apparently elm was only used as it was plentiful and cheap which it no longer is. Following on from the steam engine project, the next project is to use these funds to design and build a bolter, a silk fabric sieve to grade the flour. Our aim to mill on open days has not been possible, basically due to the lack of volunteers to operate the machinery and follow safety procedures, also hampered by low water levels.

The next open day, Sunday the 8th September is on a harvest theme with corn dolly making and other activities. And if we have the numbers of volunteers and water levels are up, there will be a demonstration of milling. In October we have the Craft Fair followed by the Halloween Experience at the end of the month. We are always looking for new volunteers. Please contact any FOAM member. (see P.38)

Minutes of Sible Hedingham Parish Council Annual Parish Council

Meeting Held in the Village Hall on Monday 12 August 2024 at 7.30 pm

In the chair – Cllr Beavis

Apologies for absence Cllrs Adam, Hendry & Lee

Public Comment A resident reported the pavement from the Church up towards Prayors Hill has bushes encroaching on the road and pathways - referred to the Finance, Governance and Audit Sub-Committee.

Matters arising from last minutes Reference was made to the encouraging uptake of the D-Day 80 Clocks; Cllr Ranson was thanked.

Reference was also made to the acquisition of a beacon for the village. There is S106 money for public art, which could be put towards the beacon. The Clerk is checking a possible covenant on Greys Hall Meadow and will source some quotations; ideas will be presented at the next meeting.

County Councillor's Report Cllr Schwier asked if people would take a picture of overgrown footpaths using the What3Words app for the Clerk to send to him. ECC do not always own the land in question and some responsibility lies with private landowners.

The Chelmer Valley Park and Ride has returned to Broomfield Hospital from Thursday 1 August. It will run every half-hour from 6:30am to 8:00pm, Monday to Friday. The shuttle will be run by Essex County Council's minibus fleet, Ugobus, with standard Park and Ride ticket prices.

Essex Highways has launched its grass-cutting program to clear verges. Grass within a metre of road edges is trimmed twice a year by Essex Highways.

Cllr Schwier will look into the booking system at Braintree Recycling centre.

District Councillors Reports The Medical Centre has gone out to tender.

BDC have voted to promote sport as they recognise its importance for wellbeing.

D/Cllrs Beavis and Taylor met with the Local Police Officer to discuss community safety and how it can be improved in the Hedinghams.

Cllr Taylor gave an update on the Wethersfield Asylum Centre. There is an upcoming Wethersfield Airbase Scrutiny Committee meeting.

Chairman's Report Cllr Fennelly has raised the use of photo ID badges/lanyards for Councillors with Cllr Beavis. These can be especially useful when talking to residents. Cllr Fennelly has also raised the awareness of the key codes on the gates of the

Recreation Ground and Grey's Hall Meadow, should the need arise for access of emergency vehicles.

Volunteer Policy and Risk Assessment This policy will ensure protection for the Council and volunteers. This policy is in addition to the Green Heart Champions previous training and risk assessment with BDC - approved.

Sub-Committee reports:

Finance, Governance and Audit – The next meeting - Thursday 26 Sept 2024. Climate and Environment – Cllr Beavis and Clerk to look at dates for the next meeting. Events, Community and Communication – There has been no meeting but Cllr Taylor reported the Parish Magazine is financed for this year, although there will need to be planning for next year. Cllr Taylor is to source new advertisers and Cllr Young to contact the new advertisers. Cllr Beavis suggested approaching One Medical to use the Parish Magazine for updates on the Medical Centre.

Planning – (St.Peter's View Meeting) – The Planning meeting on Monday 29 July 2024 was non-quorate, however the residents forum went ahead as previously planned. Many attended and spoke of the issues they are facing. A summary of the meeting has been circulated. A formal complaint is to be compiled by the community to be an agenda item at the Full Council Meeting on 9 September 2024.

Police/Crime/Safety Relevant CCTV footage of damage being caused has been forwarded to Essex Police and added to the investigation. The Recreation Ground and vandalism will be discussed at the next Events, Community and Communication meeting – date to be arranged.

Car Parks and parking concerns It was deemed necessary to find an appropriate way of managing the parking issues in the future. The Parish Council can liaise with the Co-op to ensure the parking bays are used fairly and with consideration for others. The Chairman advised the meeting that the Parish Council took ownership of the Car Parks from BDC to enable free parking. Possible future options were discussed and the Chairman agreed further consideration must be given to the concerns; this item will be placed on the agenda for the October meeting.

St James Fair at the Village Park: Thank you to everyone who supported and helped to make this a happy and successful afternoon.

RESOLVED: To make this an annual event, in co-operation with other village groups and organisations. St James Fair 2025 will be held at the village park on Saturday 26th July 2025.

Cllrs Doe, Dover and Smith will support the clerk and village maintenance staff in organising the fair.

Dog waste bag dispensers: A sample dog waste bag dispenser and a quote for 10 dispensers at £85 including delivery were provided to Councillors.

RESOLVED: To approve a BDC Councillors grant application for 10 dispensers for key points around the village centre and footpaths, together with a supply of compostable dog waste bags.

HIGHWAYS & PUBLIC RIGHTS OF WAY

FP 24 Rushley Green: Bridge repair Essex Highways ref. no 2928424 – work is in progress.

FP25 Scotch Pasture: RESOLVED: To accept the offer of a Service Level Agreement from Essex County Council for the Parish Council to cut this footpath in future years. This is a payment to the Parish Council of 15p per metre for mowing, making a total of £46.96 per cut.

Overgrown trees Sheepcot Rd: Essex Highways ref: 2930496. Landowners are being contacted by ECC. Cllrs Southgate and Allen reported difficulty avoiding oncoming traffic. Cllr Doe reported possible tree inspection activity last week. **Action:** Clerk to request Cllr Schwier chase this with Essex Highways.

Tree root damage to footway, Sudbury Hill: At the request of a resident of New Park, a trip hazard caused by a tree root raising the surface of the footway has been reported to Essex Highways ref: 2933067

BDC LOCAL PLAN REVIEW Decision on a response to Castle Hedingham Call for Sites submitted in the parish, due by August 16th. The parish map showing sites submitted and a list of sites is online at www.castlehedingham.org Each site was considered individually and the response to Planning Policy at BDC will be published on the Parish Council website. As a third tier settlement in the Spatial Strategy (Braintree District Local Plan 2022), Castle Hedingham lacks many facilities to meet day to day needs and is not considered to meet the tests for sustainable development. Castle Hedingham is on the agenda for the Local Plan Sub Committee meeting on 2nd September.

ELECTRIC VEHICLE CHARGE POINTS AT MEMORIAL HALL CAR PARK. RESOLVED: To consider further an offer from ECC to organise two EV charging points for rent at the car park, including requesting a site visit to assess feasibility. No final decision will be taken without assessing the need for and practicality of this proposal.

REWILDING AREA. NEW PARK

Cllr Dover had sourced chestnut logs to install posts along the boundary to prevent parking on the grass area - these will be installed shortly. Cllr Southgate proposed investigating the option of double red lines to prevent parking on that side of the road and the footpath – these would be the same as near the Co-op in Sible Hedingham and are the only option for a parking restriction that can be patrolled with CCTV and automatically enforced by the North Essex Parking Partnership. 


